9. Outcome of the event:

K.C. Das Commerce College, Chatribari Guwahati organised a programme under the Brikhya Bandhu Initiative of the Government of Assam on 12th August 2026. The programme was jointly organised by the ECO-CLUB, NSS and NCC of the college to promote environmental awareness and encourage students to take responsibility for nature. The programme was graced by Shri Vijay Gupta, Hon'ble MLA, Central Guwahati, along with the Councillor Mr. Sankar Chakraborty, Local Ward Committee President Mr. Prabhat Singh Lahkar and Hav. Anand Kumar Thapa, PI Staff, 1 Assam Bn, NCC. Mr. Vijay Gupta highlighted the importance of planting and nurturing trees, emphasising the motto of the Brikhya Bandhu Initiative to plant trees and befriend them. Dr. Hrishikesh Baruah, Principal, K.C. Das Commerce College, also spoke on the occasion focusing on the importance of tree plantation and community service. The programme was smoothly conducted under the guidance of Dr. Upasana Chakravarty, Coordinator, ECO-CLUB and her team, with the active support of the NSS and NCC unit of the college.

A Saplings Distribution Programme under the Brikshya Bandhu Initiative, Govt. of Assam, was jointly organised by the Eco-Club, NCC Unit and NSS Unit of K. C. Das Commerce

College, Guwahati, at Kankan Nagar, Punjabari area on 18 August 2026. As part of the college's commitment towards environmental conservation, promotion of greenery and creating awareness among the local community, a total of 2,000 saplings received from the Forest Department of Government of Assam were distributed among approximately 350 households in the locality. The programme encouraged residents to plant and nurture the saplings around their homes and in suitable community spaces. The programme was conducted under the guidance and coordination of Dr. Upasana Chakravarty, Coordinator, Eco-Club; Dr. Swapna Smriti Mahanta, Students' Union In-charge; and Dr. Ananta Pegu, NCC Officer, NCC Unit, K. C. Das Commerce College. Members and volunteers of the Eco-Club, NCC Unit and NSS Unit actively participated in the distribution and interacted with the local residents to encourage greater participation in environmental protection.

The initiative was well received by the residents of Kankan Nagar and Kailash Nagar. The distribution of 2000 saplings among 350 households is expected to contribute toward increasing green cover, improving the local environment and fostering a sense of environmental responsibility among the community. The programme concluded with an appeal to all beneficiaries plant, protect and regularly care for the saplings so that the initiative may contribute to a greener and healthier environment in the years to come.
