

FIELD STUDY REPORT 2020

The Management Department of the College conducted a field study on 7th March 2020 at Dikshak village of Sonapur under Dimoria Development Block of Kamrup (Metro) district. The main objective of the field study is to examine the impact of different schemes implemented by Assam State Rural Livelihood Mission (ASRLM) in the selected area. 157 students participated in the field study. The students are divided into several groups under the supervision of the faculty members of the Department conducted the study in the area. Each group collects the necessary data through the questionnaire distributed to the household of the area. The collected data have been analyzed and interpreted by different groups. Findings were made on the basis of analysis and recommendations were made on the basis of finding drawn from the data collection.

Interpretation: From the above table it can be seen that Kanaklata Mahila Sabalakaran Yojana is the scheme which is known by 78.94% of respondents especially women. Swatch Khowa Pani Yojana is known by 45.26% of respondents and Handloom Value Chain is known by 42.10% respondents. Ajeevika Grameen Express Yojana is implemented newly in area therefore only 23.16% respondents know about it.
